

Health Leaders Cite Limited Ability to Share Clinical Information as Key Obstacle to Value-Based Payment

HFMA researchers surveyed 117 senior financial executives about their organization's value-based payment readiness. This was a follow-up from the HFMA study conducted in 2015.

INTERNAL ability to aggregate clinical information across networks and between hospitals and physicians

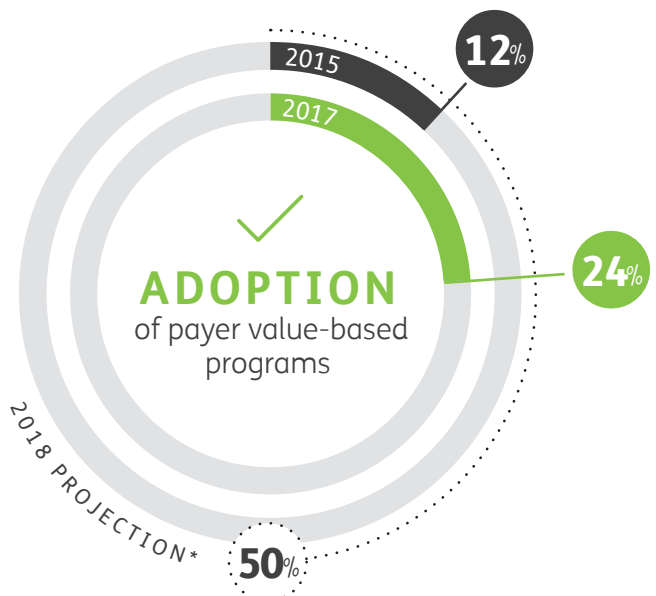
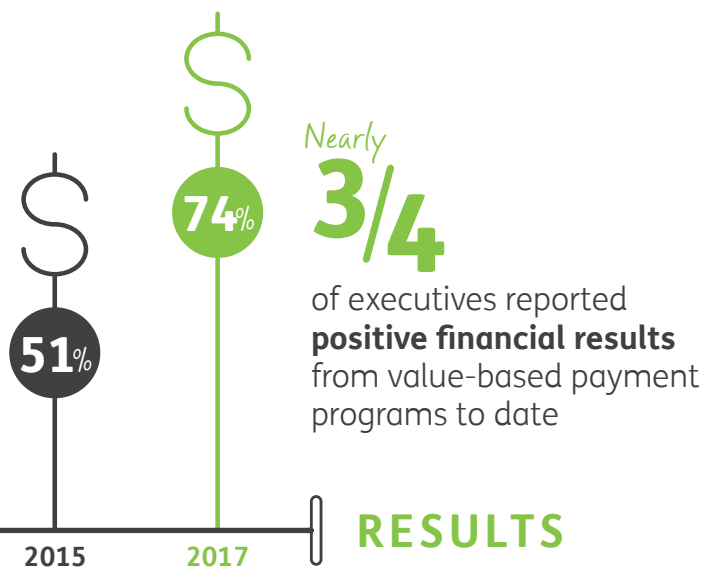


70% OF EXECUTIVES ANTICIPATE EXTREMELY IMPORTANT NEED
