


Total Rate of Confirmed Infections by State per 100,000

March 7, 2020 - March 8, 2023




Total State Death Rate per 100,000

March 7,2020 - March 8, 2023




Rate of Confirmed COVID-19 Infections per 100,000 in Hawaii

Total Confirmed COVID Patients In-house Per Day in Hawaii




Why Hawaii performed well during pandemic

- Hawaii entered pandemic as one of healthiest states in nation
- Hawaii's climate allows outdoor activity year round
- Geographic isolation and State Government and County mandates
- Willingness of Hawaii's residents to adhere to public health measures
 - Social distancing
 - Hand washing
 - Mask wearing
 - Vaccinations
- Less political divisiveness
- Safe Travel program
 - Not perfect, but effective nevertheless
- Collaborative healthcare system
- FEMA funding






State of Hawaii ADC and CMI




Honolulu County CMI




Maui County CMI





Glidepath





Take Aways from Analysis

- In terms of mean pay, Hawaii pays well for clinical healthcare professions, ranking 13 of 51
- Hawaii's COL has a major impact on Hawaii salaries, for clinical healthcare professions
- Average ranking for selected clinical healthcare professions, after COL adjustment, was 51
- For selected non-clinical professions, Hawaii's average ranking was 27 out of 51
- Average ranking for selected non-clinical professions, after adjust for COL, was 50
- Overall, clinical healthcare professions pay better when ranked against other states, than other professions, before adjusting for inflation
- Regardless, after adjusting for inflation, Hawaii's healthcare workers fare very poorly, and are amongst the lowest in the nation

- Hawaii ranked 47 of 51 in terms of overall Medicaid spend per capita in 2019
- Difference on average is \$1,543 per enrollee
- Total annual spend would increase by \$692M if Hawaii was at national average

Pandemic Recovery in Hawaii

- Labor shortages continue/exacerbated
- Labor tensions exacerbated
- PPE utilization still elevated
- Screening costs continue
- Vaccination POD costs continue
- Some patient avoidance continues
- Excess illness
 - From delayed intervention and screenings
- Excess deaths
- Hospital financial system still fragile
- New normal for hospital census
 - Increased costs for insurers
- Pandemic has weakened healthcare financial situation



Pandemic Recovery in Hawaii cont.

- Continued participation in federal hospital sustainability program
- Continued participation in federal nursing facility sustainability program
- Request of state legislature to increase Medicaid professional reimbursement to 100% of Medicare
 - \$30M of state funds Total of \$70M with federal match
- Request of state legislature to increase funding for UH system
 - Increase # of nursing faculty positions
 - Increase nursing faculty salaries in community colleges
- Work with congressional delegation to increase work GPCI for Medicare professional development
- Work with state and county government on:
 - Increased entry level housing
 - Respite care
 - Affordable housing
- Increase public high school health academies
 - Number of schools
 - Number of students
- Collaboration with HSCN on nurse residency programs
- Glidepaths and scholarships
 - Increase focus on Native Hawaiian and Pacific Islanders





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
