



You are the expert.

Most legislators do not work in health care, they depend on your expertise and stories from the frontlines to fully comprehend an issue.



You are a constituent and a critical asset to lowa communities.

Legislators particularly care to hear from the people who vote them into office.

According to a Gallup 2022 poll, health care professionals are rated amongst the most trusted professions for 20 years in a row.



Health care one of the most government regulated industries in the nation.

Due to the complexity of services, equipment, and upkeep hospitals must meet the standards set by federal, state, local laws and agencies.



A significant amount of revenue comes from the government.

60% of hospital revenue comes from the government. Therefore, hospitals rely on the government to fund Medicare and Medicaid to offset costs of providing these services to every individual who steps through the door, regardless of the ability to pay.

The Legislative Process: Idea to Draft

Starts with an idea

Request for the Legislative Services Agency to draft a bill Bill draft sent to the leader of the legislative chamber

The Legislative Process: Committee





Assigned to a subcommittee.

After hearing information on the bill, subcommittee can move to committee.

Committee can take up the bill and recommend it be sent to the floor for debate.

The bill is listed as eligible and potentially scheduled for debate.



The Legislative Process: The Chamber



Bill is scheduled for debate.


Amendments are filed and must be approved by a majority.

A majority of the chamber must approve the bill.

The bill and any amendments are sent to the other chamber for consideration.




The Legislative Process: The 2nd Chamber


