







Unstable financials, workforce shortages and rapidly rising professional liability insurance costs are forcing hospitals to cut patient services.



25% of Iowa hospitals have reduced or eliminated services to mitigate staffing challenges and ensure their most-critical services remain.



35% have delayed or canceled building and improvement projects because of fiscal challenges, further eroding access to health care services.




Only 27 of Iowa's 82 critical access hospitals have obstetrics services. This threatens access across large portions of Iowa.



Health care workforce shortages are forcing Iowa hospitals to use costly contract labor, driving up expenses alongside substantial increases in drug, supply and energy costs.



lowa hospitals' total expenses are up \$2.4 billion since 2019. \$1 billion from 2021 to 2022. And \$350 million from 2022 to 2023.




Labor costs aren't the only challenge. From 2019 to 2023, Iowa hospital drug costs were up 60%. Supplies, energy and bad-debt costs rapidly increased up double digits' percentage.



From 2021 to 2023, labor costs increased by 13% (\$500 million), driven by an increase in hospitals' contract-staffing costs (an increase of 33% between 2021 and 2022 alone).

More than six out of ten hospitals in lowa report negative or unsustainable operating margins.




- In 2023, 57% of Iowa's hospitals and health systems have negative operating margins. In other words, their reimbursement for providing care did not keep up with costs.
- 65% had negative or unsustainable operating margins (less than 2%).
- The number of lowa hospitals and health systems with negative operating margins increased 60% from 2019 to 2023 (from 45 to 65hospitals).

Financial pressures are likely to get worse for Iowa hospitals with the termination of recent federal support and continued escalating expenses.




lowa hospitals' operating margins from 2019 to 2021 ranged from 1.5% to 2.5%. In 2022, the operating margin deteriorated to negative 4% resulting in a \$507 million loss from providing patient care. Federal relief funding helped stabilize the health care system and operating margins in 2020 and 2021. New support is not on the horizon.



Statewide Payer Landscape

- Medicare rate increases far below inflation.
- Medicaid rates have not increased in over a decade.
- Commercial Insurers (private contracts)

IHA 2024 Policy Priorities

- <u>Financial Strength & Access to Care</u>: Advocate for policies and programs that strengthen the financial position of lowa's hospitals and enhance lowans' access to care.
- <u>Healthcare Workforce</u>: Support policies and programs that strengthen, grow, and protect lowa's healthcare workforce.
- <u>Payer Accountability</u>: Pursue strategies to hold payers accountable for compliance with regulatory requirements and reduce provider administrative burden.
- <u>Technology & Security</u>: Monitor policies and proposals impacting hospitals' use of digital health technologies to innovate, provide high quality care, and protect patient privacy.



Healthcare Finance Policy

- Support authorization and use of hospital provider participation funds to finance Medicaid hospital quality programs, defray uncompensated care costs and support access to care.
- Oppose decreases in hospital reimbursements, including implementation of siteneutral payments.
- Support extension of Medicaid's postpartum benefit from 60 days to 12 months.
- Support efforts by the lowa Department of Health and Human Services to identify and implement solutions to reduce delays in post-acute care transitions.
- Oppose actions by pharmaceutical companies to impede distribution of 340Bacquired drugs through contract pharmacies.
- Support increased payer accountability in payment policies.
